What is the Primary Sports Funding?

The PE and Sports premium was set up by the government to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sports activities they offer their pupils.

Jack Tizard School received **£8109** for the academic year 2015-2016

Physical Development is an integral part of the day at Jack Tizard. All pupils have personalised targets linked to developing physical skills, which can include P.E. or sport activities, physiotherapy, or sensory circuits. A Multi-professional team work together to ensure that pupils' physical abilities are developed to their fullest potential.

How was the Primary Sports Funding used and what is the impact on pupils' physical development?

The Primary Sports Funding was spent as follows for the academic year 2015-2016

Horse Riding

4 classes from the primary department have been involved in weekly horse-riding sessions as Wormwood Scrubs Pony Centre. Pupils have been supported to fully engage in riding activities and over the year all pupils developed in their confidence. A range of students attended the sessions, including those with limited mobility. Staff and students were supported by physiotherapists and occupational therapists



Dance and movement session

A group of pupils have been participating in weekly dance and movement sessions. These sessions focus on developing pupils physical skills through dance. Using a multisensory approach, that incorporates visual, Auditory and tactile experiences pupils are encouraged to explore their sense of rhythm and movement. Pupils work together as a group developing their communication and interaction skills whilst engaging in physical activities that Develop enjoyment, physical abilities and confidence.
